

## Seven Ranges; Gear Recommendations

### PERSONAL GEAR:

Full Class A and Class B uniform(s)-as complete as possible – Look sharp!

1 pair of sturdy hiking boots with good ankle support;  
1 pair of tennis shoes;  
6 blank or Scouting related T-shirts;  
2 pairs of pants or jeans, 5 pairs of shorts, and belt;  
1 long sleeve shirt and 1 sweat shirt;  
underwear/socks;  
personal hygiene items;

shower shoes, 2 towels, and swim suit;  
flashlight and pocketknife;  
spending money;  
pad or plastic to cover spring or wooden bunk;  
sleeping bag and backpack;

notebook, writing utensils, envelopes, and stamps;  
blank or Scouting related hat;  
3' whipped knot rope;  
fishing pole, camera, and film (optional);  
Scout Handbook and merit badge prerequisites;  
rain gear, sun screen, and insect repellent;  
piestone wood (if applicable); and mattress (optional as youth campers, including Senior Patrol Leaders, will not be provided mattresses).

### PATROL GEAR:

patrol flag;  
twine or rope;  
dining fly;  
2qt pot, cooking utensils, and frying pan or griddle;  
water cooler and camp stove (optional).

### TROOP GEAR

buddy board (see section entitled "Special Notes on Camp Policy");  
American Flag (state flag if other than Ohio);

Troop flag (for display in campsite);

first aid kit;  
extra lantern(s).

Troops will be provided with a campsite flag by the camp staff to be flown at the parade grounds each day and to be retired at retreat. Your official troop flag should be flown in your campsite.
